A magazine editor who wanted to educate the public about the work of hospitals launched National Hospital Week in 1921. Since then, it has become one of the nation's largest healthcare celebrations.

According to Kuehler, the local hospital provides critical healthcare services that residents would otherwise have to travel long distances to find. At a time when many hospitals are cutting back on services or facing closure, KCHD has remained resilient and committed to delivering important healthcare to the community through its hospital services and clinics.

Local medical providers in a variety of specialties are also available, including those specializing in family practice, internal medicine and surgical services. Kuehler added that having these services available locally helps reduce the burden of travel for patients and their families.

The hospital district is a major contributor to the local economy, providing employment and support for community organizations and projects, all while providing important services to protect the health and safety of the community.

"We will continue to provide the critical healthcare services our community needs," Kuehler said. "Whether that is responding to a medical emergency or the everyday services and support to help our patients improve their wellbeing, your health is our promise."
